Practical guidelines for Open Access

Advantages:

- Greater visibility
- Potential impact of your publication increases because of its free and online availability
- More efficient detection of plagiarism

The Golden Road to Open Access: publish in an OA journal

The Green Road to Open Access: self-archiving in a digital repository

- Check your institution's policies about self-archiving with your repository manager
- No repository? Check <http://www.opendoar.org/> for a subject repository where you can archive your publication
- Even if you don't have kept all your rights, it is very well possible that your publisher allows you to self-archive certain versions of your publication!
 - Check your publisher's policy on <http://www.sherpa.ac.uk/romeo/>
 - No publisher's layout? Don't forget to add the correct citation !
- Negotiate your rights with your publisher and keep your rights to self-archive your own work. Author's addenda or licences (can be found on [SPARC](#), [OpenAIRE](#) or [Creative Commons](#)) can help you.
